Disseminate to students, parents/guardians and staff the Joint Operating Committee policy and school procedures governing student abuse of controlled substances. 3. Provide education concerning the dangers of abusing controlled substances. 4. Establish procedures for education and readmission to school of students convicted of offenses involving controlled substances.

Guidelines	<p>In all cases involving students and controlled substances, the need to protect the educational community from undue harm and exposure to drugs shall be recognized.</p> <p><u>Reasonable Suspicion/Testing</u></p> <p>If based on the student's behavior, medical symptoms, vital signs or other observable factors, the building administrator has reasonable suspicion that the student is under the influence of a controlled substance, the student may be required to submit to drug or alcohol testing.
