As the air gets colder and thoughts of summer are fleeting memories, here are just a few reminders to help keep staff and students healthy and safe during the next few months.

1. WASH YOUR HANDS – Cold and flu season is here to stay so wash your hands frequently, but especially before you eat.
2. Cover your coughs and sneezes – preferably with a tissue or your elbow.
3. Get vaccinated if you choose. The flu vaccine is the best way to avoid the flu. In the United States, flu season is from October to May, and it's best to get the vaccine by the end of October.
4. Self-care - Get enough sleep, eat nutritious food, manage stress, and exercise regularly.
5. If you are sick – STAY HOME. You should be fever free for 24 hours before returning to work or school.

6. Do you know what isn't afraid of the cold – lice. With temperatures dropping, students and staff start bundling up. Remember to not share clothing such as hats or beanies or hooded sweatshirts or jackets, because this is how lice get passed to one another.

- Please be aware that our school has installed vape detectors in bathrooms. These detectors are in place to promote a healthy environment and discourage vaping on campus.

Key Points to Keep in Mind:

- Detection: The detectors can identify vaping in real-time, meaning that if you vape in the bathrooms, you will be caught. Unfortunately, some students have already been caught as a result of the detectors.
 - Consequences: If detected, there will be disciplinary actions, including out-of-school suspension, expulsion, and referral to law enforcement officials.
 - Health Matters: Remember that vaping can pose significant health risks, and it's important to prioritize your well-being.
- Seniors under 18 will need a note from parent/guardian sent to guidance for any transcripts to be released to postsecondary schools.
 - Parents, please help your student get to school on time by dropping them off no later than 7:40 a.m. This will allow students to get to their locker and get ready to start their day at 7:45. Thank you for your cooperation.
 - Parents, please set up your PowerSchool account and check your student's grades often. Communicate with teachers if you have any questions/concerns.

- Students may utilize Google Classroom to access assignments and resources.
- After School Extra Help has begun. Students can sign up through CCTI's website by clicking on the student tab, scrolling down to Extra Help. Door-to-door transportation is provided.
